

The LBK Community Walk is next month! That's right, it's time to rally up family, co-workers, and friends and <u>WALK WITH US</u>!

#### What is LBK Community Walk?

LBK Community Walk is a 4week walking program where participants are encouraged to form groups of no more than 10 participants and 'walk' to Palo Duro Canyon.

Groups are challenged to complete 28 miles (as a group) at the end of each week. By the end of the four-week challenges, the group would have collectively completed 112 miles, the same distance it takes to get to Palo Duro Canyon!

To celebrate the completion of the program, Lubbock Public Health and Parks and Rec. will host a celebratory walk and resource/ health fair.

### Intermediary Care Clinic (ICC)


The ICC is scheduled to open on August 12th. Clinic hours are 8 am to 11 pm on Mondays and 8 am to 5 pm on Thursdays.


### **HIV Clinic**

### **SDOH VS HRSN**

Do You Know The Difference?

It's time to unpack the difference between Social Drivers of Health (<u>SDOH</u>) and Health Related Social Needs (<u>HRSN</u>).

While related, and often used interchangeably, there is an important distinction to be made between the two...


**SDOH** are the conditions in which people are born, grow, live, work, and age that impact health outcomes, such as socioeconomic status, education access, neighborhood/physical environment, and more.

<u>**HRSN</u>** are the immediate needs that affect people's ability to maintain their health and well-being, such as housing stability, food insecurity, access to reliable transportation, and more.</u>


Here's an example to help illustrate the difference:

**<u>SDOH</u>** = Individual lives in a neighborhood classified as a food desert. The intervention = Building a grocery store in that neighborhood.

<u>HRSN</u> = Individual has low food security. The intervention = Enrolling that person in a food delivery program.
