


Members of FFA



Sweaters are awarded to a Sophomore boy and girl and a Junior boy and girl in each of the four major subjects: English, mathematics, science, and history. To be eligible for an award, students must be taking a full load of five credit courses, must have an overall average of 90 in all subjects for the immediate previous semester, must have a minimum grade of 90 in the subject in which he wishes to be tested, and must take a standardized test. The boy and girl with the highest average on his semester grade and standardized test in each of the subjects are awarded sweaters by the Daughters of the Pioneer Study Club at an assembly program the following September.
