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Mental Health Assistance for Women in Crisis

May is Mental Health Awareness month. We have many partners who help provide services that address mental health and wellness. One such program provided by Legacy Adoption Services (LAS) supports women as they battle emotional and/or mental issues that can sometimes arise with an unplanned pregnancy. They help expectant parents any time during their pregnancy, during delivery or with parents who have a child younger than three years of age learn about voluntary Modern Adoption.

Legacy's professional counselors can help to explore both parenting and modern adoption so that parents can make a fully informed choice for them and their baby's future. Many women find Legacy through a Google search

or by referral from a pregnancy center when seeking help and/or options. To be sure, to call LAS or to make a referral to LAS does not mean "a decision to choose adoption" has been made. It simply means more time - time to get information and to receive quality counseling care. If she decides on pursuing an adoption plan, her assigned counselor will support her throughout her pregnancy to create a personal adoption plan, help select the forever family for her baby, provide emotional support as well as help navigate doctor appointments, expenses and other pregnancy related needs.

Because women come to LAS presenting w/ emotions ranging from fear, uncertainty, depression to hope, LAS has a team of compassionate, licensed professional counselors positioned to provide mental health support, pre-birth to post-birth (provides lifelong counseling post birth, if needed). In short, whatever she decides about her unplanned pregnancy, LAS is there for her.

Lori Schott, Community Outreach Coordinator for LAS, is scheduled to present at the next LBK Community Networking session in June. You can expect more in depth information about LAS during the session. If you would like to learn more and/or to participate in a Q &A with Lori, we would love for you to attend. We plan to have this session in person, and will send those details soon!
