Appointments Advisory Board Overview

Board Mission, Purpose, and Goals:

Created in 1992 to encourage greater citizen participation, the Board is responsible for the following:

- ★ Advise the City Council on the appointment process
- ★ Oversee the marketing plan to recruit qualified applicants
- ★ Make appointment recommendations to the City Council in order to fill board vacancies
- ★ Attempt to achieve equitable community and demographic representation
- ★ Ensure recommended appointees meet qualifications for specific professional boards
- ★ Maintain a database of qualified applicants
- ★ Assist in training board appointees
- ★ Compile an annual report for the City Council to update them on board to community demographics
- ★ Goal: Increase diversification of demographic representation on boards and commissions
