41 Panhandle and South Plains counties. The S.U.S.A.N team is a champion of the community, providing vital outpatient services and connecting with diverse populations through various outreach efforts. S.U.S.A.N is one of LBK Community's founding partners

and has been a prominent force in the network since its onboarding in 2020.

S.U.S.A.N is what the good folks at <u>Unite Us</u> call 'early adopters.' An early adopter is a person or organization that is quick to embrace and utilize new technology, becoming a trend-setter for following individuals or organizations. Early adopters are essential because they help to drive the adoption and success of new technologies, paving the way for broader acceptance among following organizations and the general public.

The Parenting Cottage Presents: MOTHERS & BABIES



I am thrilled to announce that The Parenting Cottage has launched a new program that will run through 2024. I am excited to introduce MOTHERS & BABIES, an evidence-based curriculum developed by researchers at Northwestern University. The program aims to help pregnant and new moms in their babies' first year learn to manage stress, particularly in the at-risk populations. Researchers have found that when moms learn these stress management techniques, they expe-

rience significant declines in postpartum depression. These techniques can also be applied to other areas of their lives long-term

The program comprises a team of six certified educators who are ready to teach the curriculum. The sessions last for about a month and will be held weekly. They offer in-person and virtual classes to make it more accessible for moms. There's no cost to attend, but registration is required. Help spread the word! Congratulations, Parenting Cottage!

SPCAA Open Enrollment Notice

South Plains Community Action Association (SPCAA) Project CHAMPS Navigator Program would like to announce that Open Enrollment from the Healthcare.gov Market-place has begun and runs from November 1st, 2023 – January 15th, 2024.

If employed, with the new tax law you may be eligible for a premium tax credit that would assist you with lower premiums for your health coverage. The SPCAA Project CHAMPS Navigator Program has federally certified Navigators available to walk you through the Marketplace application process.

Navigators are local to you as we cover 32 counties across the Lubbock and Midland/Odessa area. The total list of covered counties are: Andrews, Bailey, Borden, Crane, Cochran, Crosby, Dawson, Dickens, Floyd, Ector, Garza, Gaines, Glasscock, Hale, Hockley, Howard, King, Lamb, Loving, Lubbock, Lynn, Martin, Midland, Motley, Pecos, Reeves, Terrell, Terry, Upton, Ward, Winkler, and Yoakum.

Appointments are always free, and services are provided in English and in Spanish. Enroll by December 15, 2023 for the health plan to be effective January 1st, 2024. A Note From Ariea

This month, I chose the quote, "Stop acting surprised when good things happen to you. You're a good person, and you deserve it." I came across this quote on a Sunday morning while scrolling on LinkedIn. These words hit me hard because I didn't know how badly I needed to hear them. I started to reflect on my journey leading to where I am today and realized I never gave myself credit for everything I have earned and accomplished.

For instance, I graduated from Tech with a 4.0 GPA. Everyone told me what a major accomplishment it was; heck, I was even named the College of Human Sciences 2023's Senior of the Year. But what did I say when people showered me with compliments and told me how incredible it was that a single mother was able to accomplish such a feat? I disregarded all the late nights I spent trying to understand the class material; I ignored the fact that (as much as I hate to admit) I denied my son's request to play because I was too busy studying. I then had to deal with the mental ramifications of feeling like the worst parent on earth. Not to mention doing all this while juggling two part-time jobs. I downplayed all that hard work and mental strife I went through and would say, "I'm in my 30s competing with a bunch of 18-24-year-olds; I was able to excel because I have more life experience than them, nothing more."

When I learned I was chosen for the Texas Public Health Fellowship, again, a sea of compliments poured in from everyone; I almost drowned in them. My life jacket? "I probably got the fellowship because no one else applied for the Lubbock location." And when I took over my current position within three months of being in my fellowship, my family, friends, and former professors roared with excitement and congratulations, saying they were not surprised I was able to move up so quickly. Again, I disregarded my extensive work history, which qualified me for this job, and said," Oh, I was just at the right place at the right time." I thought I was being humble by not celebrating myself and not acknowledging what I had done to get to this point. I now realize I did it because I felt I didn't deserve the fruits of my hard work.

I share this with you because when I read that quote, something compelled me to get out of bed and start writing this note. There is a reason why I came across this quote and why I felt compelled to share my story; I think it is because someone reading this needs to hear the following just as badly as I do.

"Stop being surprised when good things happen to you. You're a good person, and you **EARNED** it. Stop being surprised when good things happen to you. You're a good person, and you **FOUGHT** for it. Stop being surprised when good things happen to you. You're a good person and **WORTHY** of good things."
