

Community Friend Spotlight

Melissa Sharp: Out of the Darkness

This summer, I had the pleasure of meeting Melissa sharp and her adorable son. Melissa is a proud mother, teacher, and advocate who has turned heartbreak into action and utilizes her personal experience to help those in our community. Below is her story.

I lost my daughter Miranda rather unexpectedly to suicide in 2014. She was too proud to ask for help. Our hearts were broken. My son Morgan battled with anxiety and depression from an early age. He was trying to get help, but the wait was too long. He took his life in 2020. We had to relive the heartbreak all over again. I knew I had to do something to keep others from experiencing this same type of pain.

I began attending the Lubbock Out of the Darkness Walk and became a volunteer for the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP). As a walk captain, I had to come up with fundraising ideas. Miranda loved sunflowers, and she baked brownies for her friends' birthdays. We created Sunflowers Over Suicide at Lubbock High, selling potted and cut sunflowers, sunflowershaped cakes, decals, student-designed t-shirts, and more. We have hosted movie nights, education programs, and a campus walk to promote suicide awareness.

We awarded three \$500 scholarships to students for their active roles, and two additional students received \$100 prizes for their winning t-shirt designs. In addition, we have created handmade cards and distributed them to those who are struggling or have been affected by suicide.

As an AFSP field advocate, I emailed our congressmen requesting support for suicide prevention and mental health, and I served on the walk committee. I then stepped into the role of Walk Chair and am a founding board member of the West Texas Chapter of AFSP, established on Miranda's birthday, September 13, 2022.

This summer, I attended the AFSP Advocacy Forum in DC and spoke to staff members on Capitol Hill. I also serve on the AFSP Texas State Public Policy Council Committee. I have recently become a member of the Lubbock ISD School Health Advisory Council, and I hope to bring the AFSP education programs into all LISD campuses in an effort to promote suicide awareness and prevention among students.


