Our sixth year is remembered only because we studied our first history under the direction of Mrs. Gentry. Cathryn Gentry moved to Weinert.

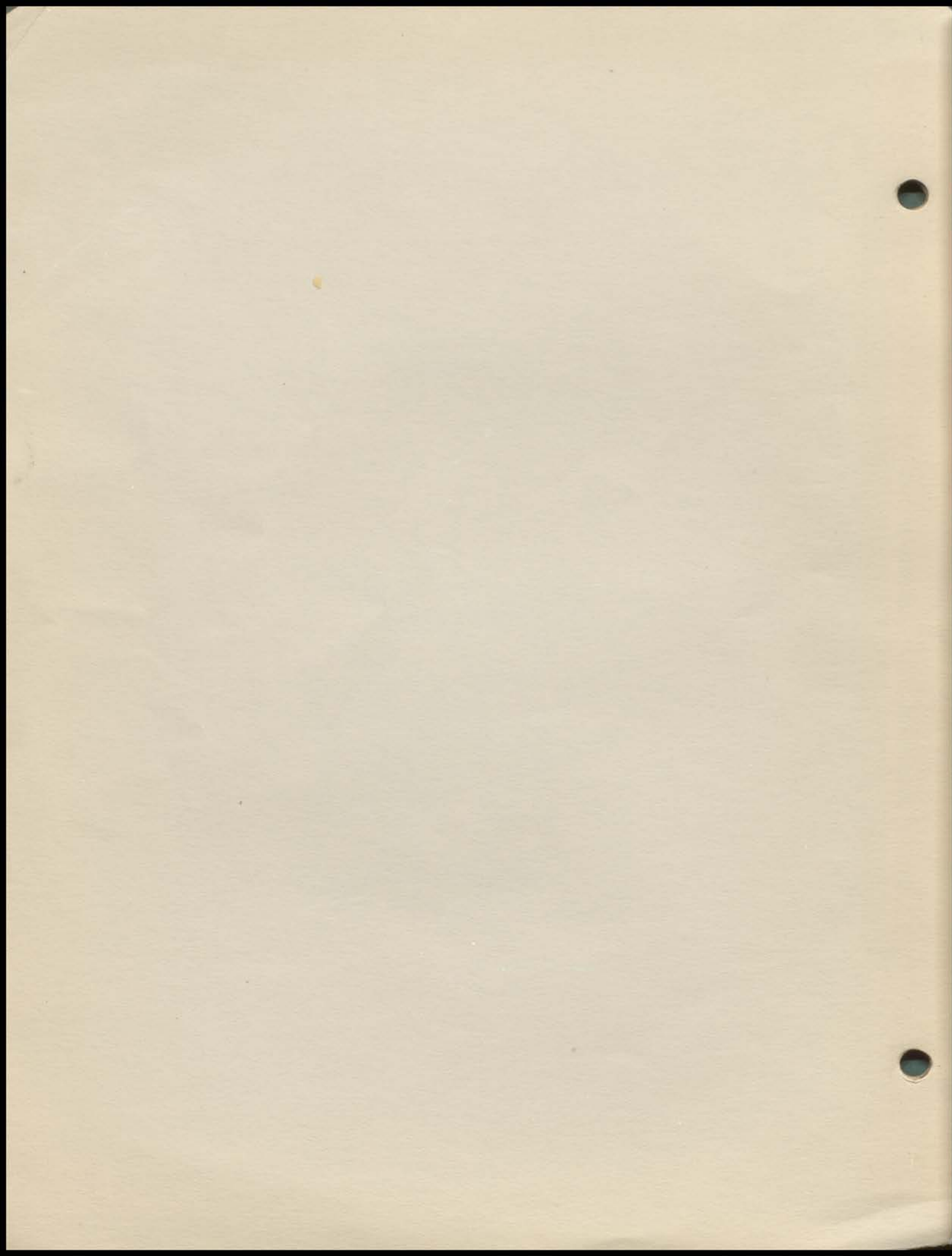
The seventh year may be remembered as one of the greatest years in our career. We were happy to have Cathryn Gentry back again.

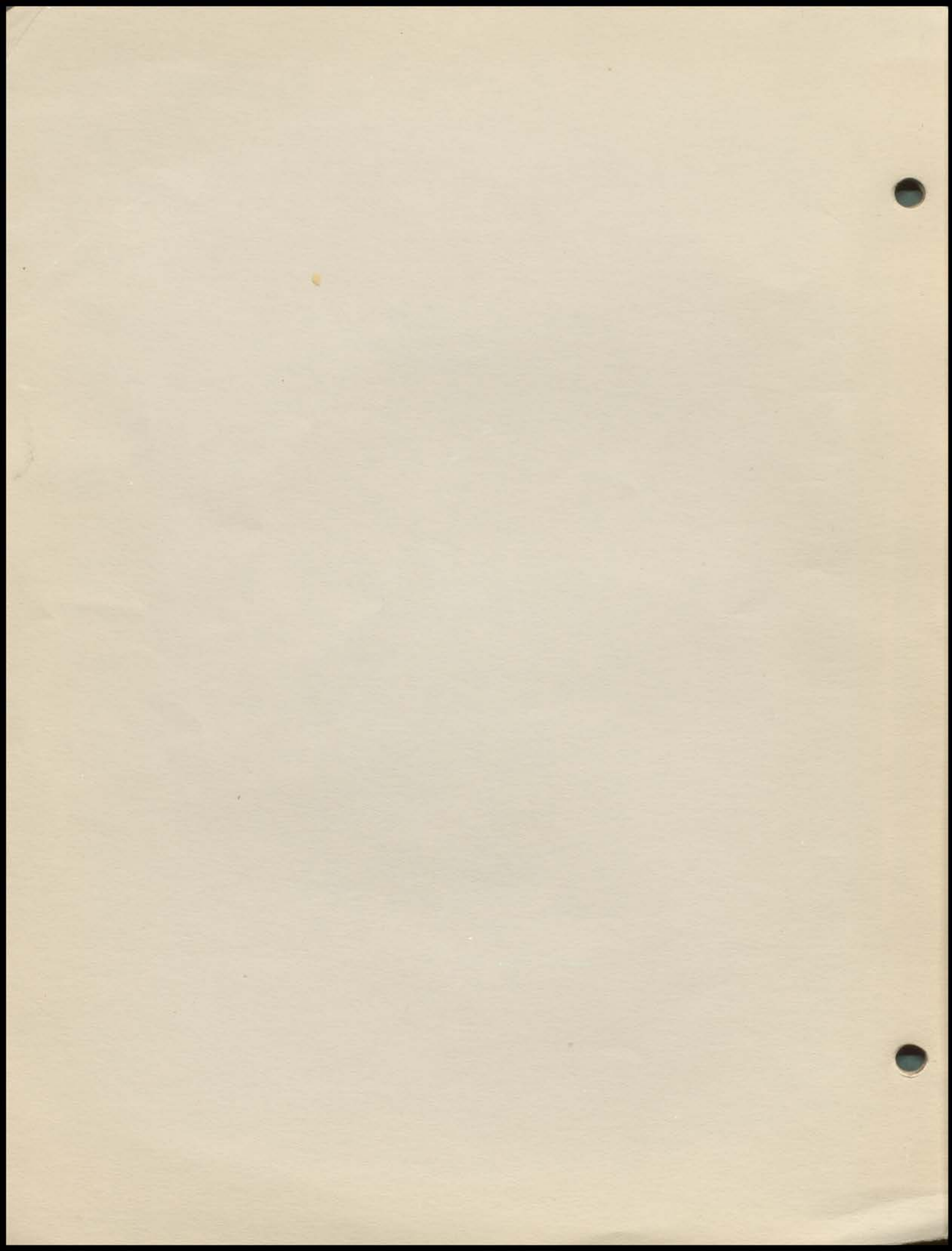






## BOYS BASKETBALL

## GIRLS' BASKETBALL

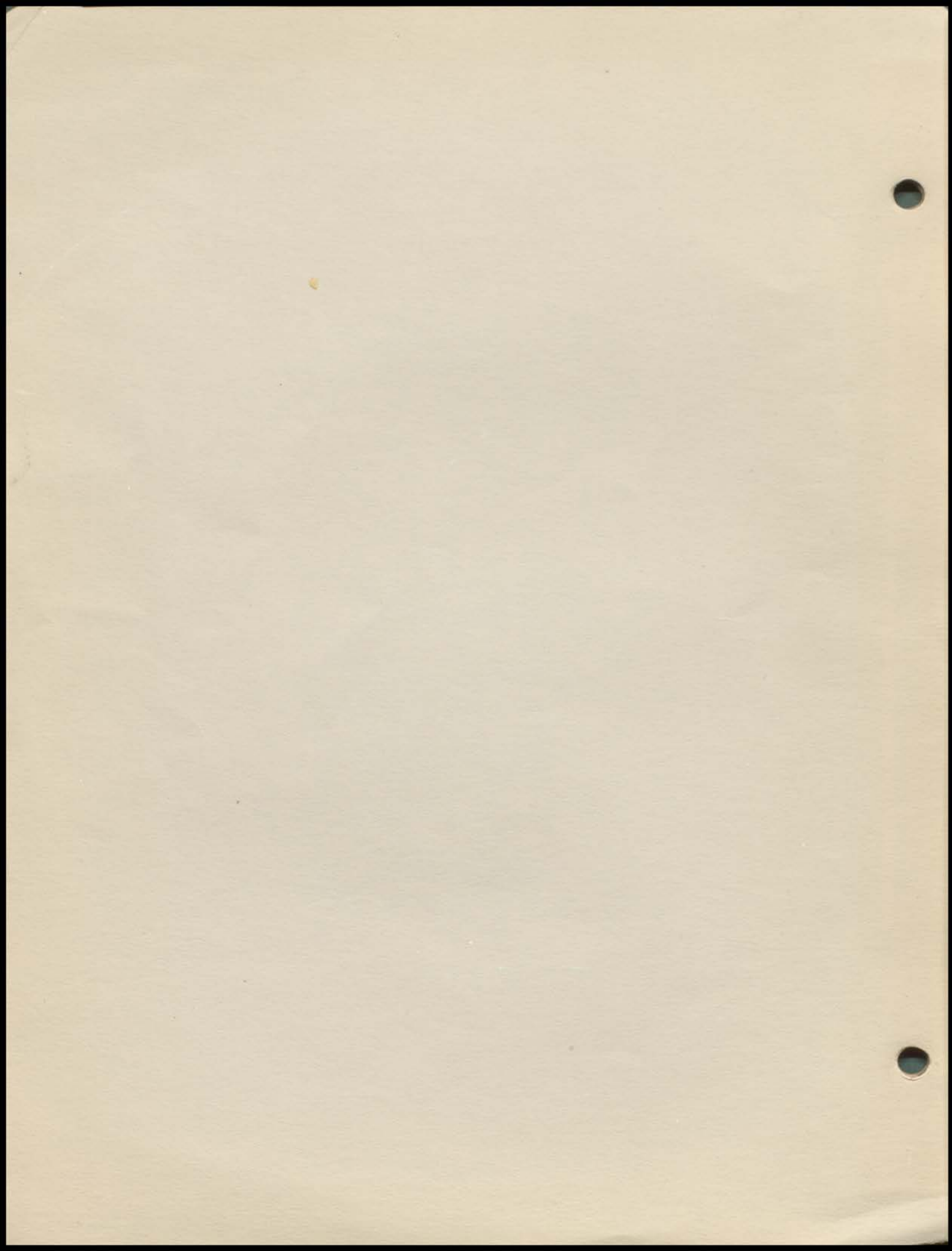
The Shallowater basketball squad had a very successful season with Miss Shaw as coach.

In the Idalou tournament we again had players on the all-tournament team, Katherine Reese and Mildred Duncan. We defeated Crosbyton to win third place.

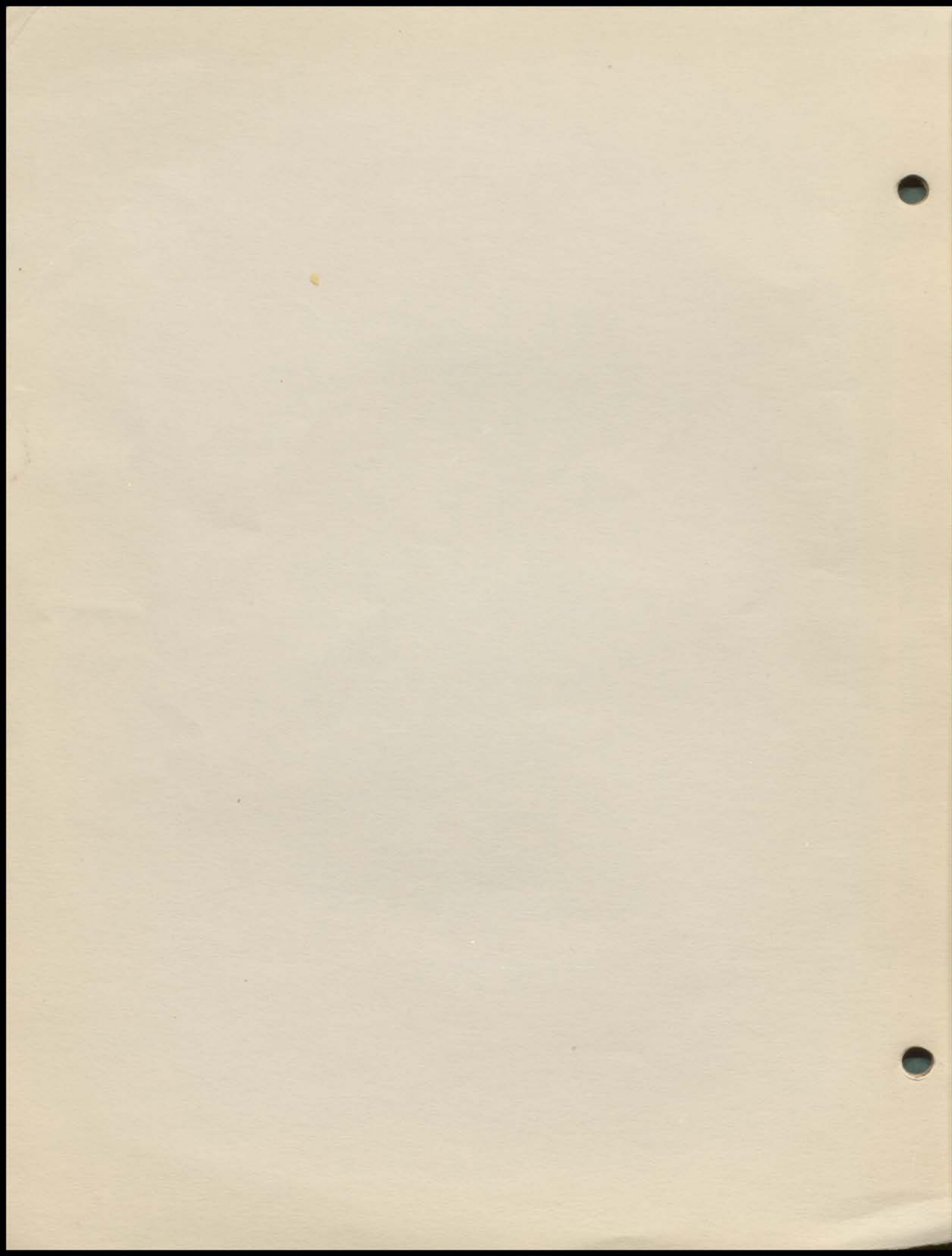

Put on radio program over K. F. Y. O.

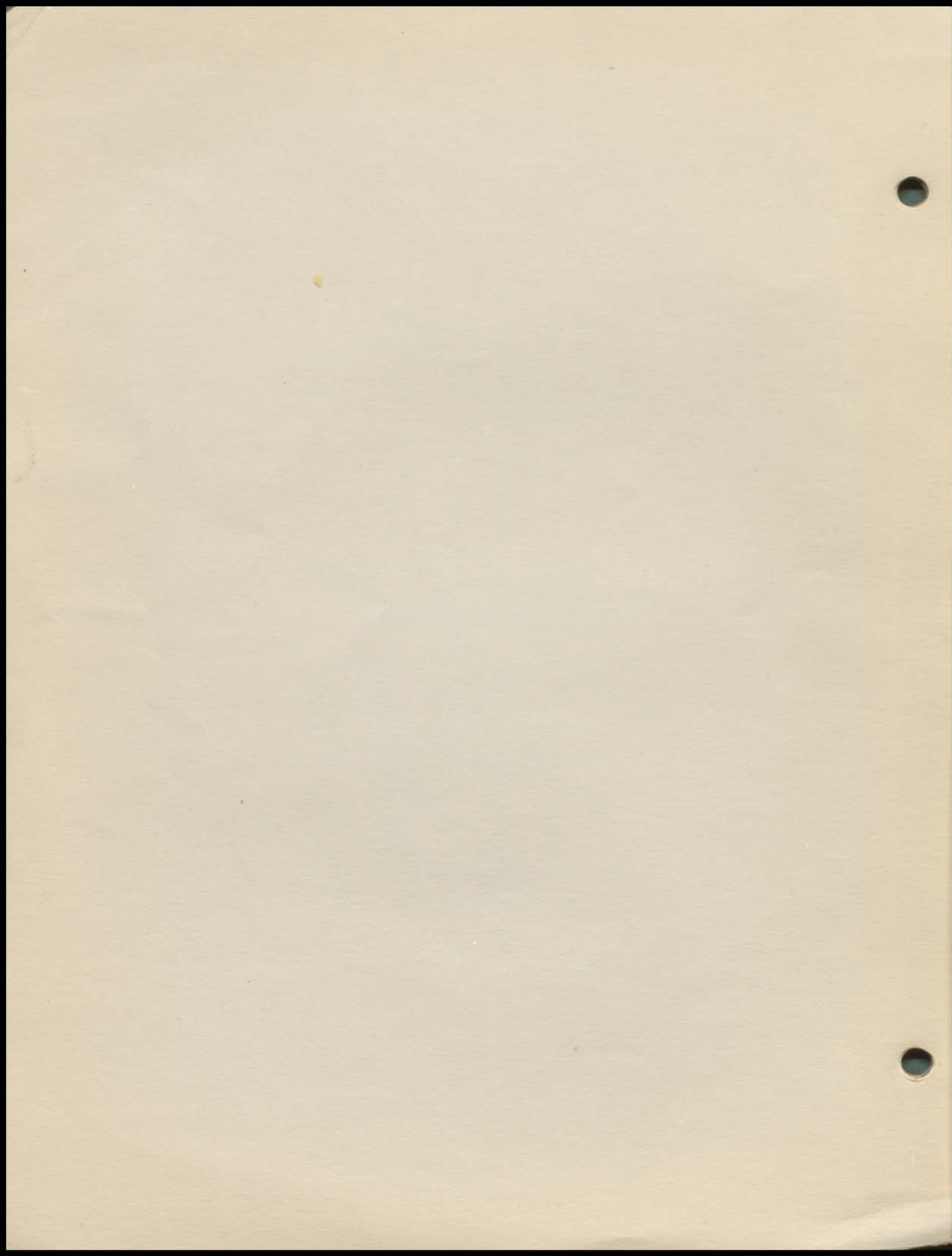
Started beautification program on school ground.
